A Critical Look at Primate Experimentation at the University of Wisconsin

Madison... The seventh in a continuing series of talks -- *Primate Vivisection A to Z* -- will be given on **January 17, at 7:00 PM in the Memorial Union**. The presentations provide a window into the hidden world of publicly funded primate experimentation occurring on the UW, Madison campus.

The Tuesday night event will examine the fear-inducing experiments on emotion conducted by **Dr. Ned Kalin**, Hedberg Professor and Chair of Department of Psychiatry, and the invasive experiments **Dr. Paul Kaufman** conducts on living monkeys' eyes.

Appropriate for lay and scientific audiences alike, the talks are the only forum open to the general public to discuss the use of monkeys at the UW.

In following months, the experiments of every primate researcher at the University will be showcased. Presentations are followed with a question and answer session; students, UW staff, and the general public are encouraged to attend.
